

CONVERSATION STARTER

When you're feeling sick, it can be difficult to remember all the things you need to discuss with your healthcare provider. This conversation starter can help you prepare for your visit and ask helpful questions that may inform your treatment plan.

Before your visit with your healthcare provider

Take a few minutes to think about your symptoms, medical history, and general lifestyle—consider writing down this information so you can share it later:

- How am I currently feeling (eg, cough, fever)?
- What serious medical conditions do I have (eg, diabetes, heart disease)?
- What medications do I take, both prescription and over-the-counter?
- Do I have a history of getting respiratory infections (eg, pneumonia)? If so, when was I seen last and what medication(s) did I receive, if any?
- Have I been on an antibiotic recently? If so, when and which one?
- Am I allergic to any medications? Have I experienced any side effects of medications that I have taken in the past?
- Am I a smoker or have I been diagnosed with a condition affecting my lungs (eg, asthma, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease [COPD])?
- What type of exercise do I enjoy doing and how often do I do it?

During your visit with your healthcare provider

These questions may help you to better understand your diagnosis and treatment options:

- What is my diagnosis?
- Based on my diagnosis, would I need to take an antibiotic? Would a different type of antibiotic than what I may have taken in the past be appropriate?
- Do any of my medical conditions put me at higher risk of complications?
- What other information do you need to consider when choosing a treatment? Can I be treated without having to go to the hospital?
